

Employee Swap Program

This is a reward type program meant to serve several benefits within the company:

Employees that meet the <u>specified qualifications</u>, are eligible to enter into the "Employee Swap Program". They will be able to temporarily transfer to one of our regional headquarters to perform their duties on that facility for one to two weeks. Each participant will be required to write a report on their time at the other facility, including overall experience and any pros and cons that they experienced.

Benefits:

Allows managers to receive feedback from an "outside" source on the day to day operations and employee relations

Facilities can idea swap to ensure best practices and increased productivity

Employees get to see the "bigger picture" by seeing each ranch facility and participating in events that may not be available in their permanent location

Unification of the separate branches

Labor pool when one facility is short handed or in need of extra resources Can schedule transports or equipment exchange in conjunction with travel Can conduct rescues for in between locations

Incentivizes employees to stay with the company and gain various skills in order to be eligible for the program

Will ensure expectations for employee performance are congruent throughout the company

Qualifications:

To be eligible for the program, employees must be approved by their Regional Manager They must be employed for a predetermined amount of time (6 months minimum) Must be an employee in good standing

Must have experience and skills in several areas of operation: trailering, training, driving equipment, loading, farrier help, vet appointment assistance, intake familiarity, and be capable of assisting with various ranch projects.

Pay:

Initial Start Up Cost:

Purchasing a camper and placing at the Scenic yard would be a fantastic investment for both this program and as supplemental housing for the Museum.



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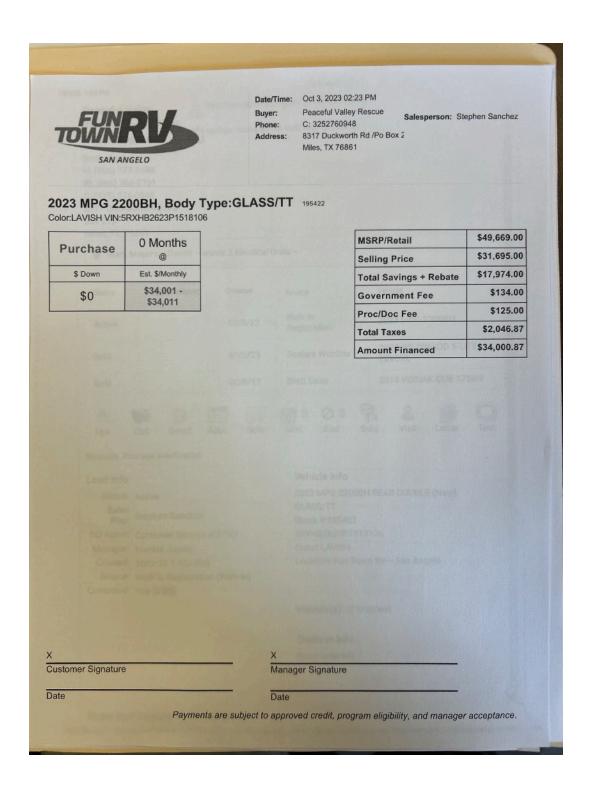
